I am writing on behalf of the Confederation of Independent Societies (CIPS), a national psychoanalytic membership association and member of the Psychoanalytic Consortium. We support the Accreditation Council for Psychoanalytic Education's (ACPEinc) application to the Department of Education to become a national credentialing agency for psychoanalysis.

Each of the Consortium's member associations has somewhat differing ideas about training standards and represents a broad range of theoretical orientations. We are united, however in our basic commitment to a broad vision of psychoanalysis as a method of treatment characterized by depth and intensity and, accordingly, as a discipline whose practice requires a lengthy and rigorous program of professional training and education. ACPEinc standards are exacting and extensive and commensurate with our common convictions about psychoanalysis.
